OVERVIEW OF TASK/WORK

Sealaska Heritage Institute (SHI) is seeking individuals to serve as 2nd/3rd Grade Arts & Literacy Integration Coaches in Juneau, Alaska elementary schools. Coaches will work with 2nd and 3rd grade educators and Cultural Specialists to co-teach and co-design lessons and provide culturally grounded Arts Integration in the Language Arts curriculum.

SCOPE OF WORK

1. Designs, coordinates and/or delivers leadership and instruction to teachers and paraprofessionals.
2. Uses coaching models and works with teachers as a group and one-on-one in their classrooms to ensure success.
3. Provides support to teachers in implementing new learning strategies, specifically Arts and Literacy Integration strategies.
4. Provides training and support to teachers, paraprofessionals, and district tutors.
5. Identifies, recruits, and enrolls teachers for program participation.
6. Regularly observes instruction in classrooms.
7. Maintains regular collaboration with SHI staff to ensure grant goals and initiatives are embedded in work with staff.

REQUIRED SKILLS

- Excellent verbal, written, and interpersonal communication skills.
- Ability to work well on own initiative and within a team.
- A strong background in Arts and Literacy integration.
- Knowledge of federal and state requirements and district policies related to teacher quality, student achievement and parent involvement.

- Evidence of improving student achievement in his/her classroom.
- Experience in scientifically research based instructional practices and strategies.
- Demonstrated ability to provide effective literacy instruction.
- Understanding in other content areas such a math, science, and technology.
- Knowledge of content in language arts and math and/or science.
- Demonstrated skills in analyzing and using data for instructional decision-making.
- Interpersonal, problem solving, communication and organizational skills required to effectively facilitate coaching and professional development.
- Ability to design and implement high quality professional development for teachers/staff.
