OVERVIEW OF TASK/WORK

The Black Seaweed Project is seeking individuals to serve as project assistants to support ongoing ethnographic research efforts. The Research Assistant will assist the investigators to carry out harvest trips, interviews, data transcription, and community engagement activities. This position provides an excellent opportunity to gain hands-on experience in ethnographic research, enhance professional skills, and contribute to meaningful cultural work.

SCOPE OF WORK

- 1) Assist with harvest trips/field observations including preparation, participation in harvesting black seaweed, taking notes about what you observe, and follow-up tasks.
- 2) Assist with interviews.
- 3) Learn and apply ethnographic research techniques.
- 4) Utilize audio-video equipment to document activities and collect data.
- 5) Assist the principal investigator (PI) with data transcription, coding, and analysis.
- 6) Collaborate with the project team to ensure timely completion of tasks and accurate documentation of activities.

REQUIRED SKILLS

- Detail orientated
- Interest in learning about Southeast Alaska Native culture
- Able to both collaborate with a team and work independently
- Ability to meet deadlines
- Strong written and verbal communication skills
- Ability to travel as needed
