### **OVERVIEW OF TASK/WORK**

Sealaska Heritage Institute (SHI) is seeking an individual to write a children's book that aligns with the goals and objectives of Baby Raven Reads and Sealaska Heritage Institute. As part of the Baby Raven Reads program, Sealaska Heritage publishes children's books based on cultural themes of the Tlingit, Haida, and Tsimshian. Thirty-one books have been published through the program since 2016, from baby board books to early readers, including several titles in the Indigenous languages of the region- Lingít, Xaad Kíl, and Sm'algyax. Stories and illustrations reflect the importance of family, subsistence, our cultural values, and our land. The books also help non-Native families about Alaska Native cultures and languages, place-based storytelling, and traditional oral literature. The author will work closely with SHI Staff throughout the development process including the planning, writing, editing and publication processes.

### SCOPE OF WORK

- 1. Each stage of development will need review by SHI Education and Media Staff.
- 2. Follow a submission deadline schedule with drafts and revisions; continue this process until SHI is satisfied with all revisions..
- 3. Work alongside SHI Staff in the planning process; ongoing dialog between the writer and SHI staff.
- 4. Work to include and enhance targeted literary elements appropriate for children 0-5 years old.
- 5. Additional cultural protocols will be written into the test as deemed appropriate.
- 6. Complete a manuscript of a developmentally appropriate and culturally relevant children's book; finalized text will be 200-600 words.

# REQUIRED SKILLS

- Ability to write engaging stories for children.
- Experienced storyteller and writer
- Strong knowledge of early childhood development.

- Strong cultural awareness and knowledge.
- Highly organized, self-motivated, and attentive to details.
