



CONTRACT POSITION: HS STEAM Academy - Anatomy & Physiology: Overnight Camp Counselor

OVERVIEW OF TASK/WORK

The High School STEAM Academy is a camp for students in grades 9-12 to interact with both Western and Indigenous ways of knowing, combining both classroom instruction and field research. This is a 5-day, credit-bearing camp with students being able to obtain a 3-credit university-level environmental science or a .5 high school science credit. The Overnight Camp Counselor will be responsible for assisting staff with activities and overseeing night-time and morning returns, supporting approximately 10 youth summer campers. Furthermore, the Overnight Camp Counselor would be helping to ensure student safety, well-being, and cultural understanding of material.

The Overnight Camp Counselor is expected to work closely with the Director, Overnight Lead, and Summer Programs Coordinator. The Overnight Camp Counselor is expected to supervise youth ages 13-19 ensuring their safety, development, skill-achievement, and general well-being overnight. This position is in charge of responding to students during the overnight period in case of emergency or incidences. Additionally, the Overnight Camp Counselor will have to complete required trainings, which include, but are not limited to: Restorative Practices, mandatory reporter training, and sexual abuse prevention training. The total pre-camp preparation would not exceed 20 hours from March to June. The selected candidate will have experience working with youth, engaging communication skills, and confidence in problem solving.

SCOPE OF WORK

Prior to camp start

- Complete and pass a background check
- Become driver certified through SHI's driver certification program
- Complete all required trainings (can be done virtually)

During camp

- Work with SHI staff and camp director to ensure execution of night schedule in a timely manner
- Engage in daily supervision of students, ages 13-19, to ensure student safety, development, skill-achievement, and general well-being during evening cultural activities
- Assist in hands-on, culturally relevant evening activities
- Respond to any student incidents or emergencies that occur in the day
- Maintain regular communication with SHI staff, the camp director, and the camp staff
- Overseeing campers; assisting teachers during class time
- Ensuring campers are behaving, especially camper to camper
- Create a fun and welcoming environment for all
- Escort students to meals and planned activities
- Accompany students on trips and outings
- Intervene in potential incidents when appropriate; follow reporting procedures and chain of command

After camp

- Give any feedback necessary
- Report any final notes/incidents that occurred at camp

REQUIRED SKILLS

- Experience and interest in working with youth
- Demonstrated effective verbal, written, and interpersonal communication skills
- Demonstrated ability to coordinate activities with attention to detail
