OVERVIEW OF TASK/WORK

Sealaska Heritage Institute (SHI) is seeking individuals to serve as Baby Raven Roving Readers to support early learning centers in Juneau. This position will work with SHI staff to schedule monthly visits to read one SHI published book and facilitate an activity with the students. All books, activities, and materials will be provided and prepared by Sealaska Heritage Institute. The Baby Raven Roving Reader will also be paired with an Elder from their community at each site visit.

SCOPE OF WORK

1. Coordinate with SHI Staff about activity supplies and instruction.
2. Build relationship with teachers and/or their mentor.
3. Visit early learning centers at a frequency of at least one day per month, or one week per season.
4. Become familiar with books and paired activities prior to visit.
5. Provide feedback after each visit to an early learning center.
6. Attend monthly professional development meetings.

REQUIRED SKILLS

- Ability to work with young children.
- Excellent book reading and storytelling skills.
- Ability to work well within a team.
